Examiner Checklist

NOTE: Some items below may or not be applicable, depending on type of exam and equipment (A/C or FSTD) in which it is conducted. Due allowance and common sense shall apply.

Pre-Exam:

- Check valid Licence/Ratings/Certificates/Medical
- > Check "Flight Examiner Handbook"
- > Check "EASA Examiner Differences Document"
- Confirm if notification and approval are necessary
- > Web portal/e-mail & approval
- Check applicable Form(s) Review instructions

Introduction:

- Give a positive first impression
- Welcome / Presentation
- > Feel the "pulse-rate" of the candidate
- Arrange isolated location for briefing (briefing only with candidate/crew)

General Information:

- > Show your ID & Examiner Certificate
- > Ask & check candidate's ID
- ➤ Legal basis (OPC / LPC)
- > Maximum credit

Documentation/Paper Check:

- Licence, Medical, Ratings & English LPR validity
- Training records / Course completion certificate
- Logbook to verify 10 sectors or sector w/ examiner
- Applicable Form explain sections & items and Pass/Partial/Fail policy of the exam

Examination Program:

- > Time schedule
- > Test procedure and expected flight profile
- Discuss tolerances (altitudes, speeds, etc...)
- Clarify real/simulated emergency actions and roles
- Discuss use of R/T
- Rules repetition of failed item during the exam & termination/interruption of exam

Pilot/Crew Briefing:

- Listen only
- > No questions during briefing
- WX briefing
- ➤ NOTAM
- > Fuel / Performance calculation

- Aircraft status (documents/techlog/maintenance release)
- > Any other pertinent items applicable

Oral Examination:

- 8-12 theoretical knowledge questions focusing
 - Air law:
 - Meteo:
 - Instrument procedures;
 - Aeroplane systems;
 - Flight preparation.

Decision:

- Candidate demonstrates adequate level of knowledge?
- Wx conditions/aircraft-FSTD status/airspace restrictions
- ➤ GO / NO-GO

Short Break:

- > Start without pressure to practical part
- > Create confidence
- > Recall use of bathroom!
- > Fix meeting point

During Flight:

- > **NO INSTRUCTION**
- ➤ Passive behaviour → no command
- No interference in pilot's decisions, except in the interest of safety (A/C)
- Follow flight progress, <u>safety first</u>, <u>take</u> notes
- > No debriefing

Emergency:

- > SAFETY FIRST
- Observe minimum required M-items
- > Conservative on double or triple failures

Facts for Decision:

- > Only facts might count
- > Accurate documentation during session
 - on a personal note sheet
 - directly on Form
- Disclose result / facts
- Check passed / failed / partial pass



Preparation of Debriefing:

Fix time and arrange isolated location for debriefing (<u>debriefing only with</u> <u>candidate/crew</u>)

Paperwork / Forms:

- > Complete paperwork: No stress
 - Logbook, licence, forms
 - According Guide for Skill Test
- > Prepare your debriefing

Debriefing:

- > Keep short and essential
- > No instruction
- > Show help and support
- Positive perspective

Completion of Test:

- ➤ Hints & Tips
- > Collate forms and docs

Communication:

- > Feedback from candidate
- > Feedback to ATO, RF, Operator
